

#### Sample

Samples can be be brought to the office or a visit can be scheduled.

#### **Results**

We will send the samples to the lab and help with reading the results.

#### **Amend**

Suggestions will be made to improve your soil's health.











#### **Tips for Successful Soil Sampling**



Use a soil probe, auger or trowel and clean container for the samples.



Soil depth of 3-4 inches.



Collect enough soil to fill a pint mason jar.



Label samples as you identify the field.



Garden - at least 12 slices or cores; Fields -12 or more slices or cores. No more than 25 acres per 1 sample.



#### Q & A FSA Program - ECAP

Authorized by American Relief Act, 2025, the Emergency Commodity Assistance Program (ECAP) provides economic assistance payments to eligible agricultural commodity producers for the 2024 crop year. These payments help producers mitigate the impacts of increased input cost and falling commodity prices.

#### What is the application period?

March 19, 2025 to August 15, 2025

## I didn't file an FSA-578 acreage report in 2024, am I still eligible for the ECAP Program?

Yes, late-filed acreage reporting is available for ECAP purposes until the August 15, 2025, program deadline.

#### Is honey eligible for ECAP?

Honey, wool and mohiar are ineligible commodities for ECAP.

The species we will be showing treatment methods for in the field include Autumn Olive, Tree of heaven, Bush Honeysuckle, Oriental Bittersweet, Multiflora Rose, etc. We highly recommend this meeting for landowners who are signed up for Forestry CAUV, as invasive control can be a requirement for the tax break program. The information about treating invasives can be very complex, so we hope to clarify proper treatment methods and to answer any questions you may have about mechanical removal or herbicide application.

The presentation will take place outdoors and will be rain or shine. Please dress accordingly and wear proper footwear for an easy to moderate hike on uneven ground.


